



Subject RE Curriculum Impact Statement 2024-2025

Overall synopsis / developments

- Established a consistent approach to the teaching of RE this year as all year groups have passed the lessons onto Mrs Groarke.
- Continued to use Questful RE as instructed by the Diocese of Blackburn.
- Fully implemented the floor book method of recording the majority of work.
- Continued with an individual book alongside for monitoring purposes.

Inclusion

- Every child has a voice in RE, linked to the British Values taught in school.
- Pupils are encouraged to share their ideas and opinions and are given the opportunity and time to reflect upon their own beliefs and values.
- Resources are adapted by support staff where necessary.

Subject leadership – CPD, Monitoring and Evaluation

- Co-ordinator has attended 2 of the RE network meetings this year, continuing to strive to persuade the Diocese that the changing dynamics of Blackburn are no longer heavily Christian based and that our pupils need more awareness of other faiths and non-religious beliefs that they will actually come into contact with.

Highlights / Cultural Capital

- School has benefitted from having the Vicar in on various assemblies.
