



PE Curriculum Impact Statement

2024 -2025

Overall synopsis / developments

We have invested in PE Passport and Lancashire PE planning as a base for our teachers to deliver the PE National Curriculum. Staff are required to deliver a **minimum** of 2 hours of physical education per week.

PE Passport provides staff with end points for each unit of work, which allows them to be able to adapt lesson plans accordingly whilst still teaching key skills.

Our Sports Premium money has been spent accordingly on key areas we felt a priority at Longshaw Community Junior School. The priorities this year were: providing and improving opportunities in sport for pupils with SEND; increasing participation and access for girls in sport; and providing or improving opportunities in sport for disadvantaged pupils.

Inclusion

A large proportion of our sports premium money has been spent on improving and providing opportunities for our learners with SEND and disadvantaged children. Our subject lead has great links with contacts for disability sport within the borough and runs disability specific clubs in school allowing all children the opportunity to compete.

We have invested in a range of specialist equipment to use in PE lessons to allow **all** children chance at success and progression of skills.

Subject leadership – CPD, Monitoring and Evaluation

Sports Premium money has been spent on CPD opportunities in gymnastics where staff have taught collaboratively with a specialist coach throughout the year.

Subject leads have taken part in CPD for tennis, cricket, and fundamental movement throughout the year.

Highlights / Cultural Capital

Extra-Curricular:

Wide ranges of clubs are on offer to children throughout the year. Both staff and external providers deliver these. We use our sports premium to subsidise these costs to provide opportunities in sport for disadvantaged pupils.

Intra-School Competition:

House competitions are timetabled in keeping with the SGO events timetable. Children are able to represent their house in cross-country, netball, football, cricket and rounders. Some of these are whole school events.

Inter-School Competition:

From our sports premium we pay into the BwD SGO competition package. This allows our children in every year group many opportunities throughout the year to participate in both competitive events and festivals.

Pupil Voice (including ambassadors)

Children at Longshaw mostly look forward to and enjoy PE lessons. For many of our pupils it is a chance for them to release their energy in a positive environment.

"I would like more clubs available to Y3/4"

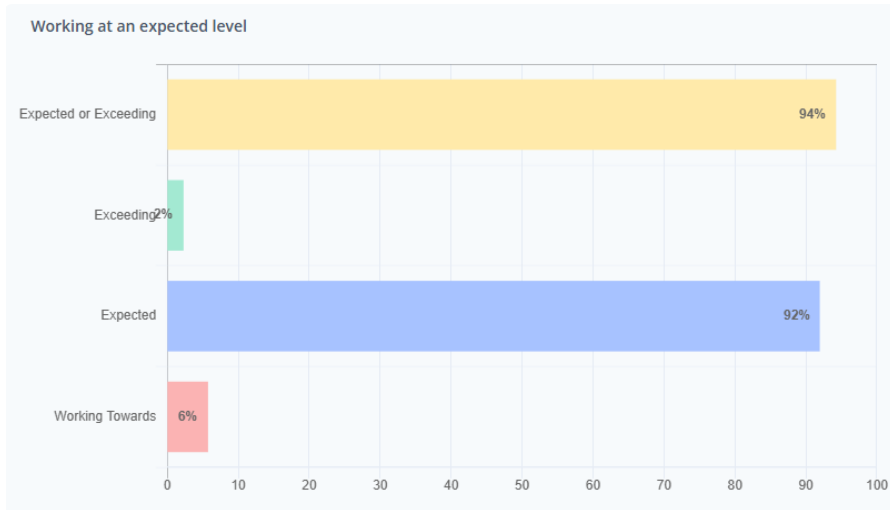
*"It is fun. **Everybody** can join in"*

"It has given me lots of opportunities this year"

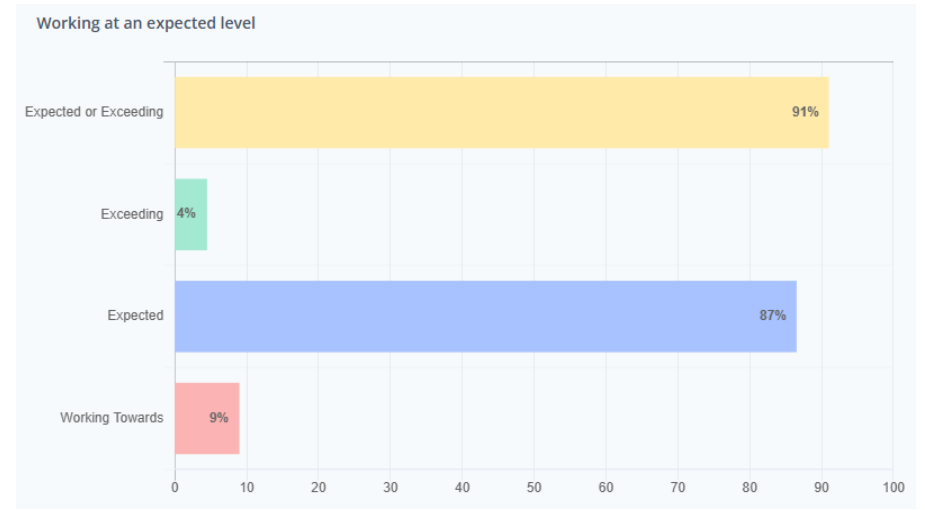

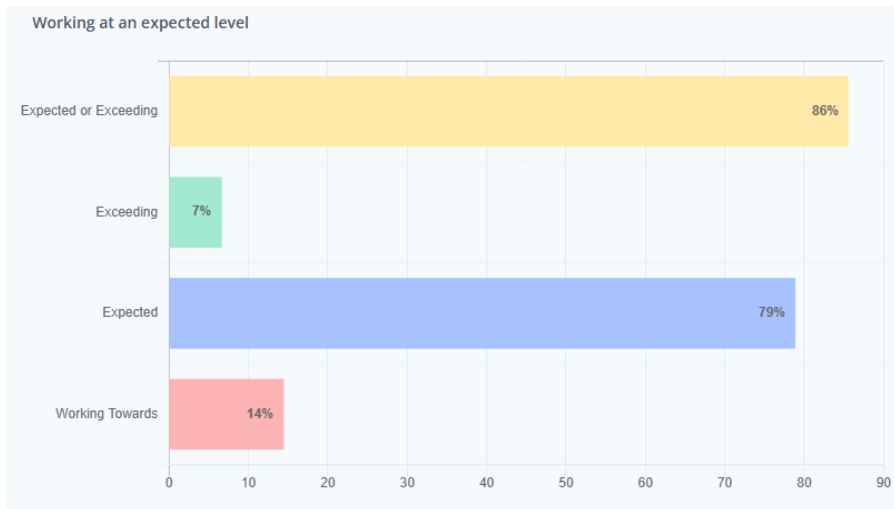
