

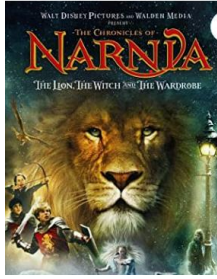


Year 5 Curriculum Newsletter: Autumn 1 (2024-2025)



Below are the key learning links for each subject for this half term.

English



During the half term we will cover a range of Key objectives using our focus text *The Lion the Witch and the Wardrobe*:

- To be able to explain the meaning of key vocabulary
- To be able to make predictions based on information stated and implied.
- To be able to draw inferences around characters' thoughts, feelings, actions and motives.
- To be able to explain the meaning of new words within the context of the text.
- To be able to be able to justify opinions and elaborate by referring to the text
- To be able to identify, discuss and collect effective words and phrases which capture the reader's interest and imagination.
- To identify the features of a non-chronological report.
- To be able to read texts that are structured in different ways for a range of purposes.
- To prepare formal presentations in groups
- To use expanded noun phrases to convey complicated information concisely.
- To plan a non -chronological report.
- To be able to use paragraphs to organise writing in non-fiction texts.
- To be able to write a non- chronological report.
- To plan and write a fantasy story.

Physical Education

Invasion Games

- Show a range of dribbling skills when in possession
- Adopt a sideways on position to receive the ball
- Overlap and underlap: make runs which overload the other team's defence
- Importance of defending as a team and need to be alert in defence having eye on the ball and opponent
- Demonstrate leadership skills to pass on attackers
- Be mobile and fluid in attacking and not stick rigidly to one position.



Health Related Fitness

- Children show an understanding of the importance of being physically fit.
- Children understand different areas that make us physically fit.
- Children test their own and other fitness levels.
- Children to develop a basic knowledge of health related exercise and fitness training.

Please make sure that children come to school in correct PE kits and children do NOT wear earrings/sharp hair accessories on PE day.

Science

Earth and Space

- To be able to describe the movement of the Earth and other planets relative to the sun in the Solar System
- To be able to describe the movement of the moon
- To understand how shadows change during the day
- To be able to explain day and night and the apparent movement of the sun across the sky



Geography

Scandinavia

- To be able to locate Scandinavian countries using an atlas.
- To explore the climate and weather of Scandinavia.
- To explore the physical features of Scandinavia.
- To explore some aspects of the human geography of Scandinavia.
- To compare and contrast an area in the UK with an area in Scandinavia.
- To be able to plan a tourist visit to a Scandinavian destination.



Art

This half terms art is based on the space themed abstract works of Peter Thorpe. Children will be analysing his works before creating examples of their own:

- To create a space themed picture in the style of selected artist.
- To evaluate and analyse creative works using the language of art.



Maths



Place Value

- to read, write and say numbers up to 1million
- to represent numbers using counters and place value grids
- to be able to know the value of a digit in any given number up to 1 million
- to compare and order numbers to 1 million
- to round numbers to the nearest 10, 100, 1000 and 10,000

Addition and Subtraction

- add and subtract whole numbers with more than 4 digits, including using formal written methods
- use rounding to check answers to calculations and determine, in the context of a problem, levels of accuracy
- solve addition and subtraction multi-step problems in contexts, deciding which operations and methods to use and why

Geometry

- draw given angles, and measure them in degrees
- Use the properties of rectangles to deduce

RE

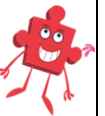
