Roman Art

- The Romans admired the Greek culture and arts.
- After conquering Greece, they brought many Greek artists to Rome to make sculptures for them.
- Roman art includes architecture, painting, sculpture and mosaic work.
- Roman sculpture played an important part of the Roman daily life.
- The walls of the homes of wealthy Romans were often decorated with paintings. These paintings were frescos painted directly on the walls.
- The Romans also made pictures from coloured tiles call mosaics.



Pop art

- **Pop art** is an art movement that emerged in the United Kingdom and the United States during the mid- to late-1950s.
- Pop art artists used commonplace objects as subject matter, such as advertising, comic books and mundane objects.

Andy Warhol

- **Andy Warhol** (born Andrew Warhol (6 August 1928 – 22 February 1987) was part of the pop art movement.
- He was famous for exploring popular culture in his work, using brands like Coca Cola and Campbell's Soup (which was one of his favourite things to eat).
- Andy often used silkscreen and lithography to create his pictures.



Roy Lichtenstein

- **Roy Lichtenstein** (October 27, 1923 – September 29, 1997) was an American pop artist. during the 1960s,
- He was known for his paintings and prints which commercial products and popular culture icons like Mickey Mouse.



Clarice Cliff

- **Clarice Cliff** (20 January 1899 – 23 October 1972) was an English ceramic artist active from 1922 to 1963.
- She became a ceramic artist, becoming the head of the factory artistic department.



René Magritte

- **René Magritte** (21 November 1898 – 15 August 1967) was a Belgium surrealist artist.
- He became well known for creating a number of witty and thought-provoking images.
- He often depicting ordinary objects in an unusual context.
- His imagery has influenced pop art.
