L.S. Lowry

- **Laurence Stephen Lowry** (11th November 1887 – 23rd February 1976)
- He was an English artist.
- He was an artist who spent much of his life in Salford.
- Lowry is famous for painting scenes of life in the industrial districts of North West England in the mid-20th century.



Banksy

- **Banksy** is an anonymous British street artist and film director.
- He creates his street art using a stencilling technique.
- His works of political and social themes have been featured on streets, walls, and bridges of cities throughout the world.

Expressionists

- The Expressionist movement occurred during the early part of the 1900s and started in Germany
- These artists wanted to paint about emotion. It could be anger, anxiety, fear or peacefulness.
- The subjects are often distorted or exaggerated, which are painted in vivid and shocking colours.

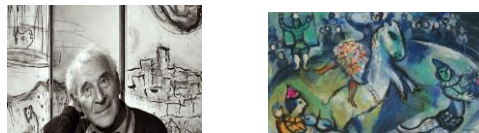
Edvard Munch

- **Edvard Munch** (12 December 1863 – 23 January 1944) was born in Norway.
- Many of Munch's works show life and death, love and terror and the feeling of loneliness.
- His most famous painting is 'The Scream'.



Marc Chagall

- **Marc Chagall** (born 6 July 1887 – 28 March 1985) was a Russian-French artist.
- He worked in many types of medium, including drawing and painting, print media and stained glass.
- Chagall was an expressionist, as well as a surrealist.



Ancient Greek Art

- Ancient Greek culture was full of different types of art.
- Ancient Greeks decorated almost every part of their lives, from their buildings and city streets to the inside of their homes,
- Greek artists created masterpieces in painting, metal work, mosaic, sculpture, architecture, literature, and pottery.
