## Behaviour Award - Cricket Focus

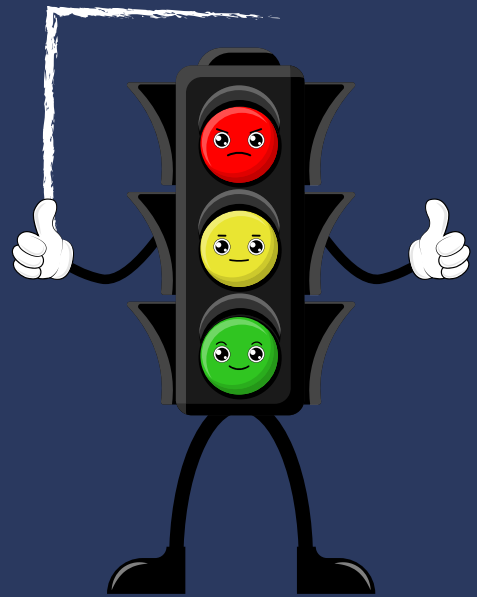
