Thank you for your continued support during this warm period. As always, it makes a tremendous difference.



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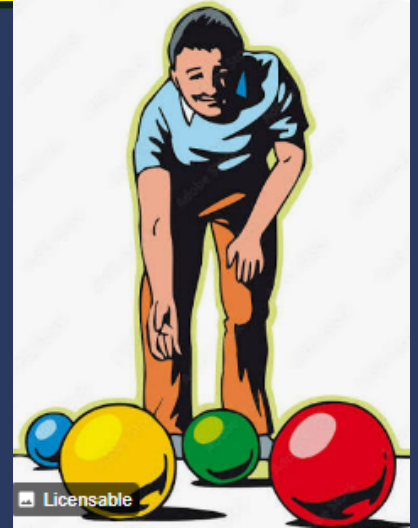
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Boccia Regional Finals

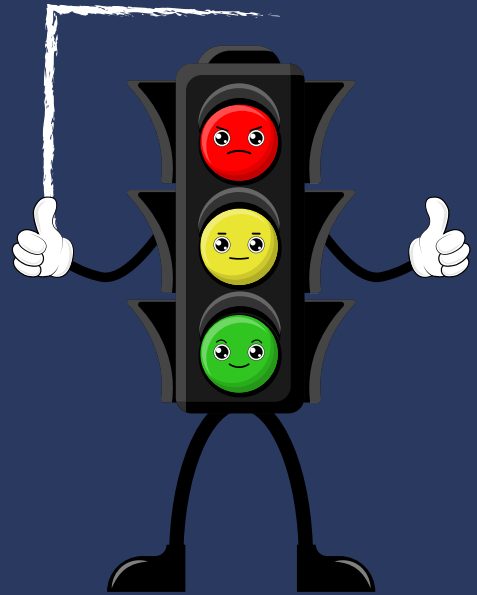
